<p><b>Proposed revision to PTO Bylaws</b></p> <p>Christian discussed the need to clarify some portions of the bylaws. These changes deal specifically with the role of the committee chair person. These revisions are designed to allow each event to be planned successfully. Motion was made by Christian Becker and seconded by Susan Fraioli to vote on revisions to the bylaws. Those in attendance voted to approve the following revisions to the bylaws. There were no dissenting votes.</p> <p>Revisions to the bylaws:</p> <p>Vote #1: Article VI title changed to: "Duties of Event Committees"</p> <p>Vote #2: Point H under Section 3 revised to state "Have all flyers and promotional material approved by the Vice President and school principal at least 45 days prior to an event."</p> <p>Vote #3: Addition of points L and M to state, "L. Failure to present an event plan 45 days prior to an event will result in the event being cancelled.</p> <p>M. Repeated failures to perform chairperson obligations may result in the removal of committee chair by the Executive Board with a simple majority vote. Reasons for removal can include, but are not limited to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Failure to present event plan.</li> <li>2. <p><b>Guest Speaker: Principal Kelley Brunner on upcoming school testing</b> This year, Kyrene will be doing Interim Assessments. These assessments are formative, which means that the teachers use the data as a checkpoint to</p>	

see where students are at during the time of the assessment. The first interim assessments began last week and will continue for one more week. Students are being assessed on math and English language arts (ELA). The older children are assessed for 90 minutes. They will be giving 4 times a year, however this year students will only be taking two assessments. They are currently on the cycle for interim 3. Staff will hold data analysis meetings and teachers will create administrative support to determine how to make instructional decisions based on the data.

**AZ Merit**

Typically, Kyrene has tested in April, which is at the beginning of the testing window. They are considering moving this date back to allow students as much time to prepare for this assessment. It is essential that 100% of eligible students take the assessment. Colina has always reached this 100% testing standard. It covers both ELA, math and writing.

Mrs. Brunner would like to encourage parents to make sure that students get plenty of rest and eat a good breakfast that day. However, although this test is a high stakes test, it is also important that parents do not stress students out. With Move On With Reading, students must show proficiency in reading standards by the end of third grade in order to advance to the 4<sup>th</sup> grade. The school will offer intensive intervention to any student who does not pass this level of proficiency, and they will be re-rested. Colina has a high success rate with students who have received this intervention passing the re-test for this assessment.

Javiar Hernandez with NAPAC introduced himself. Emails will be coming out shortly about this organization. They assist native American families participate in activities and receive assistance for services. They work closely with the Kyrene Foundation.
